For example, a family with a child in Year 8 and in Year 10 would be invoiced: Tuition fee Year 8 Student +Tuition Fee Year 10 Student + Year 8 Levy + Year 10 + Family Levies = \$9,440 p.a. or \$4,720 per child.

Tuition Fees and Levies Early Payment Discount

The College offers a discount (pro rata for split billing) of \$250 for one student, \$400 for two students or \$550 for three or more students for yearly fees paid in full on or before 1st March each year.

Note that this discount is not available to those families who receive a discount through an approved concession.

Explanation of Fees and Levies

Tuition Fees

These fees are calculated based on the recommendations of Brisbane Catholic Education.

Resource Levy

This levy is charged on a per student basis to cover such expenses as subject resources, incursions, guest speakers, excursions, transport, student accident insurance, sports and cultural costs, student diary, student identification cards, other general administrative costs, college magazine and additional textbook hire. The levy covers Information Technology Resources and infrastructure, hardware and software. In addition, the levy also includes overnight camps that are an integral part of the curriculum program where this is offered to specific year levels and attendance is not optional.

Capital Levy

This is a compulsory levy charged per family. It covers the capital cost of College buildings, infrastructure and grounds, and capital loan repayments.

Special Levy - Parents

The Special Levy - Parents is charged to each family and is used to provide additional College resources for students and staff. Expenditure of Levy funds is managed through consultation between the Parents and Friends Advisory Committee members and the Principal.

Additional Extras

The following items are not included in the college Fees and Levies and fees must be paid for in full at the time of the activity or by arrangement with the college:

- Year 12 Senior Jersey, Formal and Graduation
- Year 11 Biology Camp
- Charges where noted in the Subject Handbook
- Other optional Levies

Accounts (Fees & Levies run once in February each year)

For all students, Tuition Fees, Resource Levies and Family Levies will be billed annually in February each year. College Fees are due to be paid in full within 14 days of the issue of the Statement of Fees and Levies, unless the family have established a payment plan. The due date will be noted on the statement.

Payment arrangements can be made either weekly, fortnightly, monthly or quarterly.

All payment plans must ensure that the account is cleared by the end of Term 4 each year or as negotiated with the Business Manager.

The College invites families to contact the Finance Team at the College if there is difficulty paying fees by the due date. Timely communication is important as the College may be able to offer assistance in various capacities.

Withdrawal of Enrolment

Fees will be payable for the whole term in which the enrolment is terminated. For a reduction in the finalisation of an account, a written request must be made to the Principal at the time of notification and may be granted at the Principal's discretion, taking into consideration any personal mitigating factors.

Student text books, library books, and laptops and all accessories remain the property of the College and are to be returned to the College upon leaving. If any fees remain outstanding, they will be payable as per the normal payment terms and where appropriate; any fees in credit will be refunded upon written request.
